Medicaid Reform in Kentucky WHY: Unsustainable Growth, Poor Outcomes


- High poverty and Medicaid enrollment
- Poor health outcomes despite high spending
- No long-term financing plan
 - \$1.2 billion projected spending on expanded Medicaid over SFY 2017-2021

Every \$1 we spend on expanded Medicaid is \$1 we cannot spend on coverage for pregnant women, children, and individuals who need Medicaid due to age, blindness, or having a disability.



KY's Economy Ranking - #45








Kentucky will enroll non-disabled adult and children beneficiaries.*


Kentucky HEALTH is the new health and well-being program for certain low-income adults and their families.
