

# **Behavioral Health**

### Substance Use and Overdose

- Increasing access to treatment and recovery
- Engagement of community
- Opioid settlement funds

### Mental Health

- Crisis response continuum & 988
- Integrated and whole person care
- Children's mental health crisis

### Workforce shortages and provider capacity

- Peer supports and community-based workforce
- Team based approaches

# **Social Drivers of Health and Health Equity**

### Health Related Social Needs

- Target populations: health and social risk criteria
- Covered benefits:
  - Housing supports
  - Nutrition supports
  - Case management, outreach, and education
  - Infrastructure and capacity building
- AZ, AR, CA, MA, NJ, OR, and WA received section 1115 demonstration waivers

### Reentry from Carceral Settings

- 90 days of in-reach services to support transitions to the community
  - Case management
  - Clinical consultations
  - Medications (incl. MOUD)
  - Community Health
    Worker services
- CA and WA received section 1115 demonstration waivers

### Health Equity

- Race, ethnicity, age, language, and disability data collection, curation, and contextualization
- Community engagement and fostering partnerships
- Whole-person and personcentered care

### **Maternal and Perinatal Care**

Midwives: Trained birth workers who provide care during the perinatal period.

- All 50 state & DC Medicaid programs reimburse certified nurse midwives (CNM)
- At least 19 states reimburse midwives without a nursing degree in Medicaid
- States are also:
  - Expanding covered services
  - Including CNMs as primary care providers
  - Implementing payment reforms

Doulas: Nonclinical birth workers trained to provide support during the perinatal period.

- Taking action to increase access to doula services (at least half of states)
- Implementing doula benefits in their Medicaid programs (8 states and DC)
- Encouraging managed care to offer doula services
- Using Title V dollars or pilot programs
- Establishing training and certification

### **Coverage Extensions**

- 12 months postpartum coverage
- Continuous eligibility for children

# Aging

### Direct Care and Family Caregivers

- Severe shortages in direct care workers
- Role of family caregivers
- States approaches:
  - Medicaid reimbursement
  - Develop career pathways
  - Ensure financial and workplace security

Home and Community Based Services

- States are rebalancing toward home and community-based services
- States approaches:
  - Expand technology and remote supports
  - Continue Medicaid HCBS flexibilities implemented during the public health emergency

### **Nursing Homes**

- More than 70% of Americans do not want to be in nursing homes
- States approaches:
  - Nursing home report cards
  - Incentivize quality improvement projects
  - Nursing home quality accountability task forces
